Preamble

The UBC Dietetics Program is committed to advancing equity, diversity and inclusion for the Program and dietetics profession, as it relates to the Program's vision of inspiring learners to advance dietetic practice and food systems. Our core values of justice, integrity, inclusion, collaboration, and community-focus drive our approaches to Program admissions planning, delivery, evaluation, and community engagement.

The Program is located on UBC's Point Grey Campus, which is situated on the traditional, ancestral, and unceded territory of the xwməθkwəyəm (Musqueam). Practice education placements take place on the traditional, ancestral and unceded territories of many Indigenous peoples, in locations throughout present day British Columbia. The Program recognizes the original stewards of these lands, and engages in ongoing efforts towards decolonization of the Program and the dietetics profession.

Policy

Admissions principles and processes are developed collaboratively, involving multiple stakeholders, such as the UBC Dietetics team, LFS Student Services and the UBC Dietetics Admissions Advisory Committee, to ensure they meet UBC, LFS and national dietetics accreditation requirements.

The Admissions Advisory Committee is comprised of internal and external Program partners, whose specific roles and responsibilities are stated in the Committee Terms of Reference. The purpose of the Admissions Advisory Committee is to gather diverse perspectives and feedback, to ensure

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admissions principles and processes align with the Program's core values and are relevant to the evolving needs of the dietetics profession.

Applications for the Program are assessed in collaboration with invited reviewers internal and external to UBC, who have familiarity with the Program and/or dietetics profession. Reviewers are selected with the intention of ensuring equity-deserving groups are well-represented. The Program provides training and support for all reviewers, to ensure the core values of admissions are explicitly stated and the approach to application scoring is standardized.

Additional details about the admissions process are communicated in the <u>UBC Calendar</u> or on the <u>UBC Dietetics Program website</u>.

There are typically more applications to the Program than available seats; therefore, admissions decisions are based on academic and non-academic application scores. The Program reserves a minimum number of seats each year for Indigenous applicants that meet the Program's admission criteria. Final admissions decisions are made by the Program, in consultation with LFS Student Services, as needed.

Offers of admission are conditional, until students compete all requirements communicated with the admission offer (e.g. Criminal Record Check, immunization review) by the stated deadlines.

All admissions to the Program are for a September start date (UBC Winter Session Term 1); students are admitted into year 3 of the Program.
