- Integrated Practice Education Placements (39 weeks total)
 - Relocation required as placements are across province
- Degree Outcome: entry-to-practice competence to become a Registered Dietitian in Canada
 - "Registered" for accreditation with EQual
- Unique Research Capstone Project
 - This is **not** a thesis-based program and does not require a Faculty supervisor

Admissions Requirements

- 1. G+PS Minimum Academic Requirements: https://www.grad.ubc.ca/prospective-students/application-admission/check-your-eligibility
- 2. Prerequisite Course Requirements: at least 72% (B+) final mark in each prerequisite course
 - o Human Physiology (e.g. BIOL 155, BIOL 153, CAPS 301)
 - o Introductory Biochemistry (e.g. BIOL 201, BIOC 202)
 - Statistics (e.g. STAT 200, LFS 252, BIOL 300, EPSE 482, FRST 231)
 - Introductory Nutrition (e.g. <u>FNH 250</u>)
 - o Introductory Food Science (e.g. FNH 200)

3. Three References

- Minimum 1 academic reference, 1 professional reference
- No free e-mail accounts
- 4. Resume/CV and Statement of Intent
 - Please use templates on website



Prerequisite Course Conditions

An applicant can have either condition A **or** B, not both.

- A. COURSES "IN PROGRESS" At the time of applying to the program, an applicant is allowed FNH 200 and a maximum of one other prerequisite course to be in progress.
- B. CREDIT COURSES Maximum of one prerequisite course can be graded as "credit" or "complete", without a percentage or letter grade. The admissions reviewers will acknowledge completion of the course, but it will not be included in the GPA evaluation.

How to report your prerequisite courses


1. Use the MND Prerequisite Flow Chart Is your course: Complete the Self Report Form A UBC Vancouver course mentioned on previous slide? On the BC Transfer Guide equivalent to UBC-V courses? On the Approved **Prerequisite List?** Complete the manual course review: Download the Prerequisite Checklist and NO YES Declare the course in conduct a self-review of pre-requisites the Self-Report Form; that are not listed. no other action needed. Declare the course(s) in your Self-Report Form and submit the checklist and relevant syllabi as one PDF document

MND 2024 Admissions Overview

- Application open until November 15th 2023
- Complete Applications must include:
 - □ UBC Grad Studies Application, including supporting documents and reference contact information
 - ☐ Pre-requisite course **Self Report Form**, including supporting documents (if required)
 - ☐ Three reference letters/forms, received by Nov 30th

How are Applications Assessed?

If the applicant meets G+PS eligibility criteria, then MND faculty will assess their application holistically:

- The GPA is calculated on the prerequisite courses only
- The resume/CV and statement of interest will be assessed in relation to the <u>program</u> <u>vision, mission, and values</u>, as well as <u>the required skills and abilities for the</u> <u>Dietetics Program.</u>
- o References are reviewed related to personal attributes and suitability for the program
- Interviews are conducted by a panel of interviewers:
 - assess applicant based on pre-defined criteria for each question
 - o oral communication skills are assessed in the context of the applicants answer

Accepting applications

- Apply to MND via G+PS Evision system
- Submit the Admissions Self-Report Form
- Referees will receive links to upload your reference letters by the system
- DDL: November 15, 2023 4pm Pacific Time
- References must be received by Nov 30th

Reviewing applications

- G+PS/LFS Graduate office review minimum academic requirements/English language requirements
- Prerequisite and equivalency, letter of intent, resume and reference will be evaluated by MND faculty members, or selected clinical instructors

Interview

- Shortlisted applicants are invited to ONE 10-15 min interview
- Interviews in early February

Offering

- Offer the admissions to the successful candidates
- Initial offers in late February
- 12-14 seats for Sept 2024
